

September 24, 2018

The Common Council Met with Mayor William McKean for a regular meeting on Monday, September 24, 2018 at 7:30 p.m. in the Council Chambers at City Hall according to the posted notice. Councilmen Gregg Sprunger, Curtis Wurster, Ron Dull, Mark Wynn and Philip Provost were present, along with City Attorney Dave Baumgartner and Clerk-Treasurer Gwen Maller.

Councilman Gregg Sprunger opened the meeting with the pledge of allegiance and Mayor McKean gave the invocation.

Minutes

On a motion by Gregg Sprunger and a second by Curtis Wurster, the minutes of the September 10, 2018 meeting were unanimously approved.

Claims

On a motion by Phil Provost and a second by Mark Wynn, the claims were unanimously approved for payment.

Board of Works and Safety Meeting Update

Mayor McKean reported that the Board of Works was informed at their regular meeting that the new security measures are now in place at City Hall and procedures are being followed. There are some minor items that still need addressed but won't affect the overall system.

Attorney Comments

Attorney Baumgartner reported that the petition for annexation for the north half of Parr Road has been filed. There will be a public hearing at the next regular Council meeting on October 9, 2018.

Clerk-Treasurer Comments

Clerk-Treasurer Gwen Maller reported that 13 applications have been submitted for the first call of the Community Crossings grant. She stated the applications consisted of milling and asphalt overlay on various streets with a total of 2.241 miles at an estimated cost of \$355,818. If awarded, the grant would cover 75% of the project with the City providing the remaining 25% as their local share. Councilman Dull asked when the City would find out if they were awarded the grant. Gwen stated that notification will be in November. There will be a second call for applications in February for Cities who were not successful in the first round. Each City is only eligible for one grant.

Mayor Comments

Mayor McKean informed the Council that one of the sub-contractors left a large piece of trenching equipment that was used for the Parr Road reconstruction project

in Poseidon's parking lot. The Mayor is working with Ben Adams, Commonwealth Engineering to find the owner so they can remove the equipment immediately.

There being no other business to come before the Council and upon a motion duly made to adjourn by Ron Dull and seconded by Gregg Sprunger, adjournment followed.
